

SAXONVILLE, MASSACHUSETTS
MERRIMACK RIVER BASIN FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT

Condition of Improvement, 30 September 1984

TYPE: Local Flood Protection - structural

LOCATION: On the Sudbury River in the village of Saxonville in the northeasterly part of the town of Framingham, Middlesex County, Massachusetts.

AUTHORIZATION: Authorized by the Congress on 7 November 1966 through the Flood Control Act of 1966.

PROTECTED AREA: Area protected includes industrial, commercial and residential properties on the left bank of the Sudbury River.

PROJECT FEATURES: Project consist of about 2,500 feet of earth dikes, 1,340 feet of concrete floodwalls, 1,000 feet of channel realignment, a pumping station, a vehicular flood gate, interior drainage and other appurtenant works. The project provides Standard Project Flood protection.

LOCAL COOPERATION: Operated and maintained by the town of Framingham, Massachusetts.
